General Field Policy

Welcome to IceInSpace AstroCamp 2011! We hope you enjoy the opportunity to meet, socialise and observe with amateur astronomers of varying experience levels under the dark skies of Lostock.

This flyer lists some General Field Ettiquette guidelines, which we ask everybody's cooperation in following. Many people will come to Lostock for the rare experience of observing at a dark sky site, and wish to gain the most from it. These guidelines will ensure that everybody can gain maximum enjoyment from their observing time at IISAC2011.

- People have come to the AstroCamp for varying reasons, some want to check
 out as much equipment as possible, whilst others wish to make the most of the
 dark sky experience with as much quality observing time as possible. If
 somebody is engrossed in their observing, don't disturb them unnecessarily.
- Never touch anybody's equipment without invitation from the owner.
- If someone is kind enough to loan equipment to you, do not on-loan to a 3rd party without the owners' knowledge and consent.
- Parents with children please keep them under supervision and control when near telescopes and equipment. Instruct children they can look when invited, but never to touch.
- Ladies, please don't wear makeup (especially mascara) if you wish to view through other peoples telescopes. Such makeup can leave greasy smudge marks on eyepiece optics and be difficult to clean off.
- Be aware of ladders, stools, tables, tripod legs and other equipment near someone's observing area. Tripping on these could damage expensive telescope equipment, and you could also injure yourself.

Light Use Policy

Welcome to the IceInSpace AstroCamp 2011! We hope you enjoy the opportunity to meet, socialise and observe with amateur astronomers of varying experience levels under the dark skies of Lostock.

This flyer lists some Light Use guidelines, which we ask everybody's cooperation in following. Many people will come to Lostock for the rare experience of observing at a dark sky site, and wish to gain the most from it. These guidelines will ensure that everybody can gain maximum enjoyment from their observing time at IISAC2011.

- Lights off after dark!
- No white light torches to be used on or near the observing field, unless otherwise advised by the organising committee (such as in the case of bad weather).
- **Dim** red led torches are to be used on and around the observing fields, and keep them aimed at the ground. Bright red head-lamps should be dimmed with paint, red electrical tape or cellophane.
- All people staying at the camp need to be mindful of the need to limit extraneous light. eg: keeping doors closed in camp buildings with interior lights.
- Blinds will cover the windows in the house so that light does not spill onto the observing fields. Red light stations will be placed in the toilet block and undercover area for your convenience.
- Laptop computers used on the field should be shielded by using a cardboard box or similar, and facing away from other observers. For visual observers, they should also have heavy red filters. For astrophotographers, red filters are also required where your laptop is in the vicinity of others.
- Green laser pointers may be used until 10pm. After this time, please be respectful and don't use them. This will be enforced! Please do not allow children to use them as toys, as they can be dangerous if pointed in someone's eyes!
- People driving into or out of the camp after dark should do so with headlights
 off. Car interior and boot lights should also be disabled to prevent them from
 coming on when opened. Car security systems should be turned off so the
 blinkers don't flash when armed or disarmed.

How to get to IISAC2011

IceInSpace AstroCamp 2011 is fairly easy to get to, but here's a few directions to help you on your way.

Google Maps

Use the following Google Maps direction link which will give you directions from the end of the F3 all the way through Maitland, Paterson, Gresford and then Lostock - $\frac{\text{http://tinyurl.com/6amy5k}}{\text{http://tinyurl.com/6amy5k}}$.

Using Whereis.com.au

Using the Whereis "Map and Directions Tab" and enter Lostock Rd, Gresford (Tyraman) as your destination. That'll get you to the nearest town to Lostock, which is Gresford. Once in the main town of Gresford, there'll be signs to follow to get you to IISAC.

If coming from the South, head to Maitland.

- Follow the signs to Paterson, Vacy and then Gresford along Tocal Rd.
- Once in the centre of Gresford (East Gresford), turn left onto Gresford Rd, and follow this for ~ 1.7km.
- Turn right onto Lostock Rd, where there's a corner store on your right hand side.

If coming from the North, whereis takes you down the New England Hwy towards Singleton.

- Head along Mitchells Flat Rd (approx 12kms), which turns left into Gresford Rd.
- Follow this for another 30 kms (approx), until you reach the corner store at the intersection of Gresford Rd and Lostock Rd.

Once you're at the Corner Store:

- Head north on Lostock Rd towards Lostock Dam.
- Lostock Rd road becomes Paterson River Rd, and winds its way for 18kms through the mountains and along the creek until you reach the turn off to Lostock Dam and Lostock Caravan Park.
- Don't turn left there; continue straight towards the Lostock Scout Camp. The road turns to a well-maintained dirt road, and travels for 6kms until your reach the Scout Camp.
- You can't miss it once you're there you'll see two farmhouses (top house and bottom house). The bottom house is the HQ. You'll see a flat camping area on the left, near the creek.
- Make sure you make your way to the bottom house HQ when you arrive to collect your info pack, hand in your forms, and collect your raffle tickets for the lucky door prize competition!

Site and Competition Rules

Welcome to the IceInSpace AstroCamp 2011! We hope you enjoy the opportunity to meet, socialise and observe with amateur astronomers of varying experience levels under the dark skies of Lostock.

This flyer lists some general site rules, as well as the rules for the Lucky Door Prize.

General Rules

- IceInSpace and the organisers of the AstroCamp accept no responsibility for the safety or security of your possessions while at the AstroCamp.
- Please supervise all young children, as there will be expensive telescope equipment that the owners won't want knocked over.
- No pets allowed. I'm sorry, there are no exceptions to this.
- When driving, be aware of local wildlife and drive slowly and carefully. The last 20km's into Lostock is narrow and winding and you never know what's around the corner. Please be careful and take your time, especially in the wet or dark.
- It is a condition of entry that you sign and hand in the <u>Acknowledgement and Disclaimer</u> form when you arrive.
- Drinking water is available at the houses, but be aware it is tank water so don't waste it.
- You will be handed a name tag when you arrive. Please keep this on you or with you at all times – it ensures you're a valid camp participant and it also serves as your "ticket" to the evening meal.
- Please be all packed up and be ready to leave the camp by 10am Sunday. We need to leave it
 how we found it, so please help clean up any mess you make and take your rubbish with
 you.

Swimming Hole Rules

- The swimming hole is there for us to enjoy, however you choose to use it at your own risk. By signing the disclaimer form, you waive any right to bring action against the IISAC organisers or any volunteers for any injury sustained while using the swimming hole.
- The swimming hole will be open from 9am-11:30am and 1:30pm-5:30pm each day. Volunteer "lifeguards" will be present during open hours to ensure safe play.
- Parents **must** supervise their children while using the swimming hole. If a child is seen in the swimming hole without their parent present, the child will be asked to leave the swimming area.

Competition Rules

- Everyone who has a paid booking (whether staying on-site or off-site) will receive a raffle ticket
 for the lucky door prize when they arrive. That is, each person on your booking will receive a
 raffle ticket. If you turn up on the day without making a booking, you can still be eligible for the
 draw if you pay when you arrive and sign the Acknowledgement and Disclaimer form.

- 4.
